

# Featured Project: One London Wall, London



## Stone Type: Limestone

An unusual aspect of this project was the requirement by the local planning authority to retain from the previously demolished building the well known Plaisterers' Hall with its highly ornate interior, which now forms the main focal point of the new development. The façade of the building is dominated by glass and other cladding materials to the upper floors, but at ground level Stirling Stone fixed a considerable quantity of limestone cladding.

The front curved elevation was very complex due to the walling being fully vented and seen from both sides. This required Stirling Stone to design an architectural quality finished stainless steel support system. Certain elevations of the Plaisterers' Hall were clad in limestone and to the entrance area adjacent to the escalators large areas of rusticated ashlar walling were also used.
